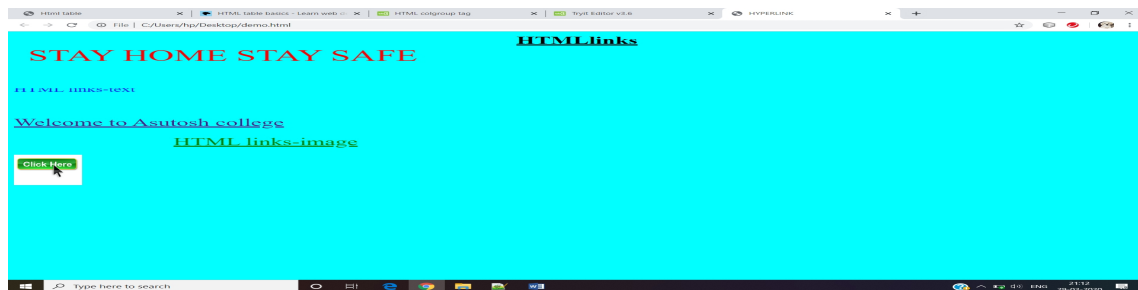
<!-----Syntax:- <a href="url">text</a>

The <a> tag indicates where the hyperlink starts and the </a> tag indicates where it ends. Whatever text gets added inside these tags, will work as a hyperlink.

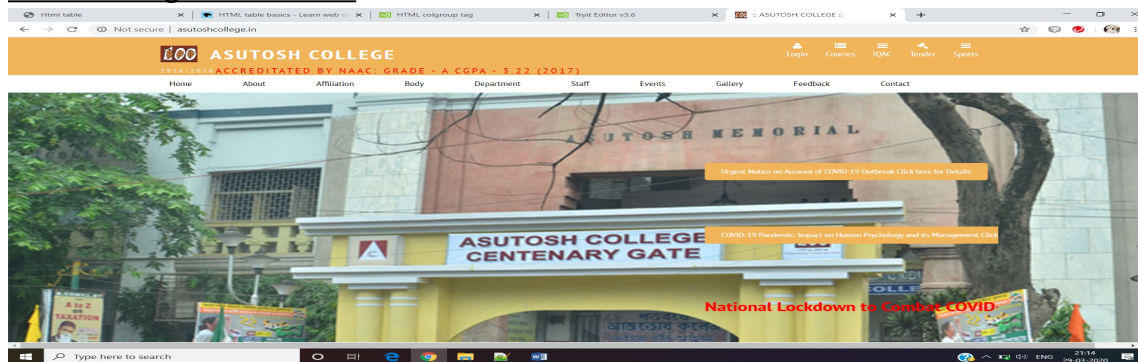
