They were lodged in the college between 26 and 28 May 2021 when government took the initiative for rehabilitation. They were also provided with essentials as well as cooked food and dry ration during that time.





Blood Donation Camp (15 May 2021)

Every year many lives are untimely lost due to lack of blood supply. The crisis heightened during the Covid period. The Asutosh family came forward during this hour of crisis to organise a blood donation camp in collaboration with People's Blood Bank on 15 May 2021 which witnessed enthusiastic participation by the staff and students even at a time when the college was officially closed due to the pandemic.





Sanitization of Neighbourhood Vaccination Centres (June 2021)

As part of the special drive during trying times, the staff and students of the college took the initiative in sanitizing twenty vaccination centres in the Bhawanipore area throughout June.





Covid Relief by the department of Environmental Science (June 2021)

The faculty and students (both present and ex) led by Dr Sayanti Kar of the department, worked tirelessly for distribution of relief and food amongst people affected by the pandemic. The food distribution was done on 17.06.2021 amongst children, disabled and aged in the slums. The relief camp was organised on 18.06.2021 wherein grocery items were distributed amongst needy people residing in Mayachar, Mahisadal, Purba Medinipur. Students who actively volunteered were Shresthashree Swain, Somasree Samanta (Both exstudents of our department) Bidisha Chatterjee (M.Sc. 2nd Semester), Saswati Sinha (M.Sc. 4th Semester) and Bijit Chatterjee (B.Sc. 2nd Semester) who coordinated among themselves over WhatsApp and social media to provide leads for oxygen, medications and bed availabilities. They have divided themselves into four categories of support: hospital beds, oxygen, blood donation and ambulance services. The aim is to see that a patient gets help as quickly as possible.




Webinar on Community Outreach Programme (23-24 July 2021)



Project ECHO (15 October 2020-28 July 2021)
