  3. Students put on a nice and aesthetically pleasing cultural presentation to the elder citizen and also encouraged them to join in singing and recitation.

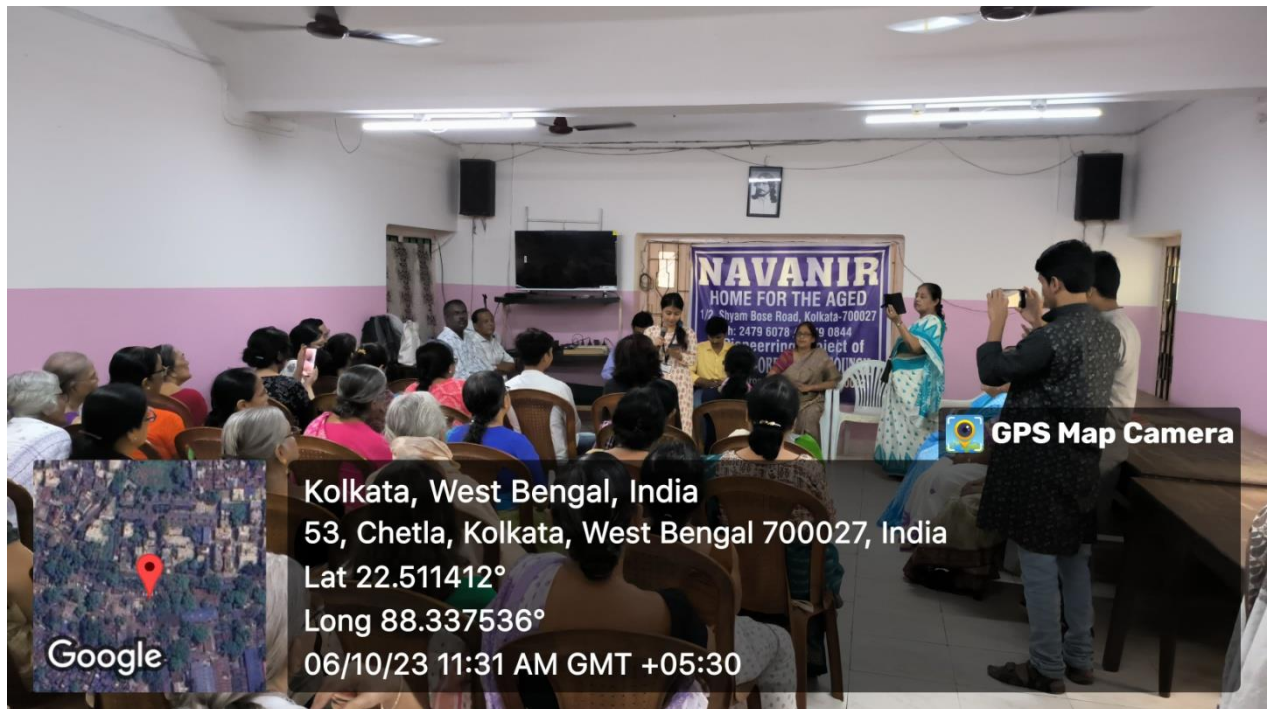


4. Faculty members along with the students handed over a token gift to the boarders which include the daily essential items. In this regard some of the parents have also contributed in this initiative conducted by the department.

  3. To ensure corporate responsibility by companies that produces or use large amount of plastic and have global collaboration amongst government and non-governmental organisations.

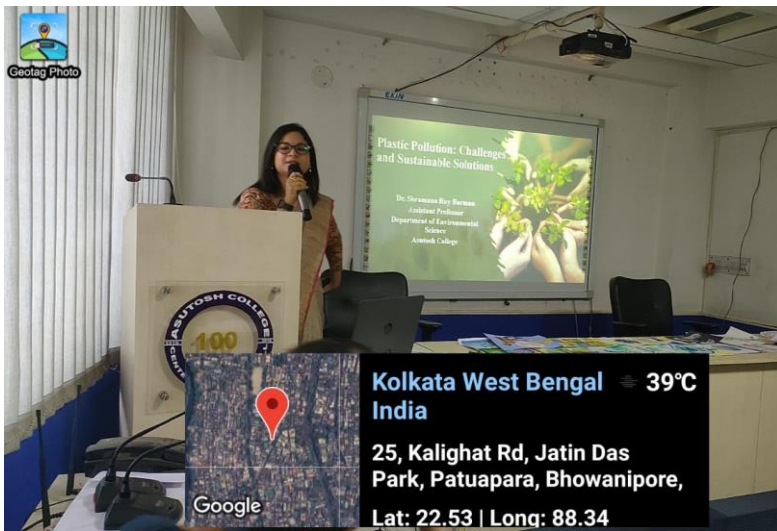

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### **An account of the activity**

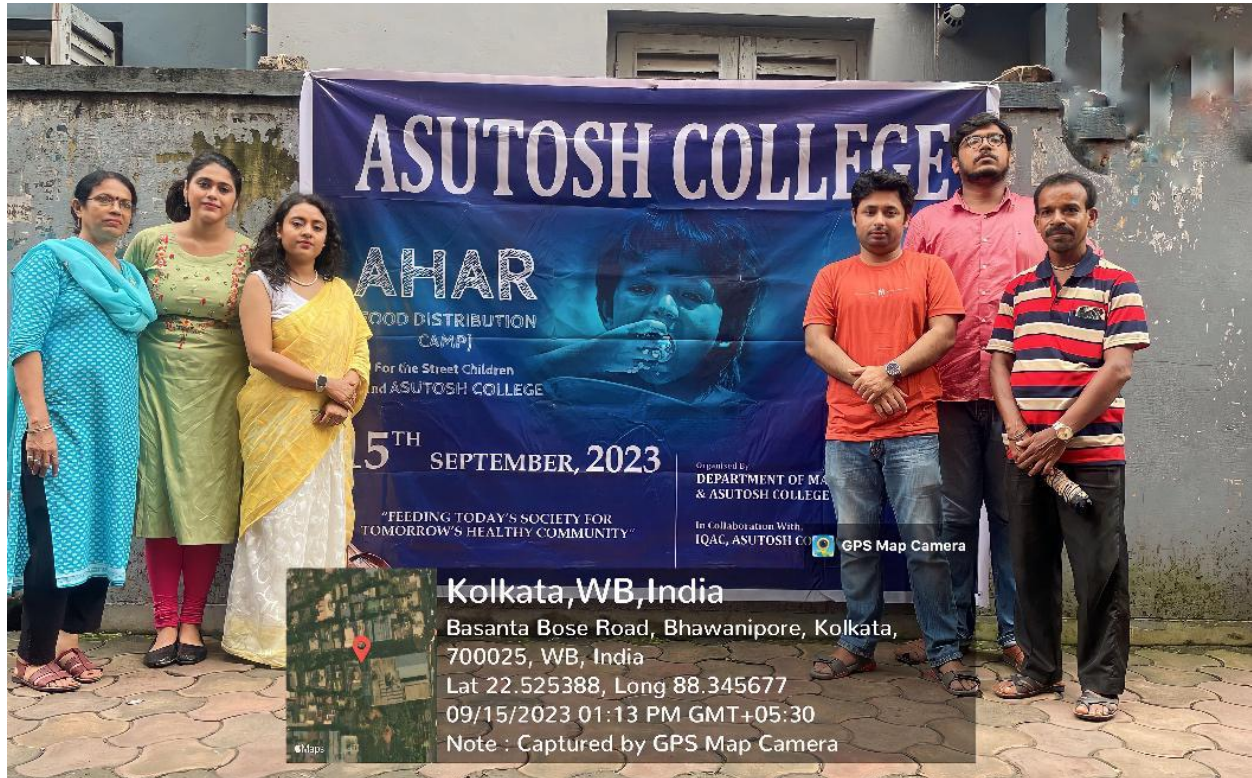
The Department of Mathematics & Asutosh College Students' Union in collaboration with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Asutosh College organized a food distribution camp on 15th September, 2023 to distribute food among the street children. The poster for the event is attached above in this report.

The students and the teachers of the department of Mathematics of Asutosh College visited the nearby slum area in the proximity of the college on 13.09.2023 and 14.9.2023 near the Rajeshwar Dasgupta Road, Bhawanipore, Kolkata-700025 to look for poor and needy street children and distributed food coupons among them. There were total 52 children to whom food coupons were distributed. They were instructed to gather behind the college main building in the Rajeshwar Dasgupta Road on 15.09.2023 with the food coupons. On 15.09.2023, from 11:00 AM to 1:30 PM the food packets containing fried rice and chilli chicken were distributed to the children. The children were very happy to receive the food packets. Earlier, the students and the faculty members of the departments collected funds to arrange for this event of food distribution. 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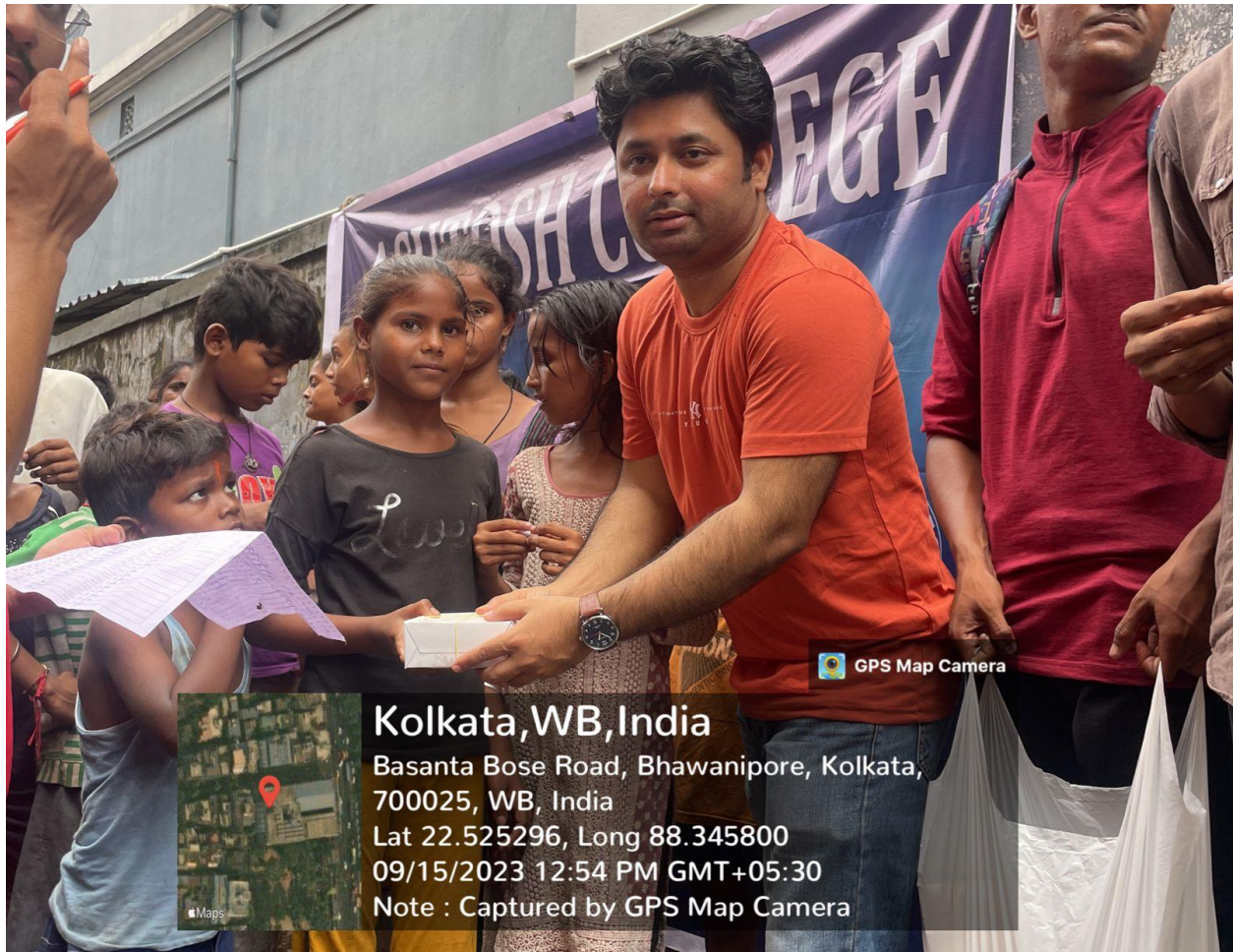
