- ➤ BRIEF REPORT ABOUT THE EVENT/ PROGRAMME: As in previous years, this time too the NSS unit of Asutosh College has organised a Dengue-awareness programme in all the college buildings and in areas surrounding the main campus. This was on 26th September, 2023. An NSS unit comprising the NSS coordinator, other members of staff as well as students of the college visited the Patuapara slum area in Bhowanipore, Kolkata, for implementation of the programme. Acting in consultation with the local residents, our team members spread bleaching powder in places where stagnant water had collected and refuse had piled up. Simultaneously they organised a clean-up of the area by collecting and removing discarded plastic waste.

A procession from the Main building to Patuapara was also organised by NSS volunteers and teachers as part of the Awareness Programme. Our NSS coordinator Dr. Parthasarathi Bera spoke about the role of good personal and community habits in keeping dengue at bay. The residents were advised to regularly clean blocked drains, to dispose of old containers, mugs, buckets and tyres, to keep water tanks and water containers covered and not to allow water to remain stagnant near their houses. They were advised to use mosquito nets without fail.

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

Medical equipment and diagnostic kits were procured and kept ready in the college premises. This included material for 100 sugar sample tests and 100 ECGs. A paramedical team was also formed. At Tentulberia, a local club handled everything from the setting up of a large tent to the generation of the publicity necessary for such a camp.

NSS team members, paramedical staff and our student volunteers participated in the programme, which was for adults only. The health check- up comprised 4 segments: Blood pressure recordings, SPO2 readings, Random blood sugar readings and ECGs. The ECG readings were declined by some participants for personal reasons.

The camp was fully functional by 12 noon and it was wound up around 4.30 PM. It was found that the participants generally displayed better health than their city counterparts of the same age. However, many displayed higher blood pressure readings than expected. Among the women, problems like gas and hyperacidity were common.

- 1. The participants were counselled about healthy practices like walking and yoga, and it is expected that a healthier lifestyle will be adopted by them.
- 2. This awareness will become transformative if we hold more such camps in future.
