### BRIEF REPORT ABOUT THE EVENT/ PROGRAMME:

The Internal Complaints Committee (ICC), in collaboration with Debate Club and in association with IQAC, Asutosh College organized an Inter-Departmental Debate Competition on the topic "Women have an equal voice in today's society". Dr Chandramalli Sengupta, Associate Professor in Bengali and Sri Siddhartha Kar, Associate Professor in Sociology at Asutosh College acted as the judges of the debate competition. Dr Sraboni Ray, Associate Professor in English & IQAC coordinator addressed the event followed by an address from the Representative of the Debate Club-Dr Sanchita Sanyal, Assistant Professor in Political Science. The programme was judged by Dr. Chandramalli Sengupta, Associate Professor, Department of Bengali, Asutosh College and Sri Siddhartha Kar, Associate Professor, Department of Sociology, Asutosh College.

The judges then touched upon the instructions of the competition followed by a brief introduction of the participants.

Students from various departments of the college participated in the event. The participants were judged based on their knowledge, logical reasoning and presentation skills. A total of eight students participated in the competition, out of which four participants spoke 'for the motion' and four participants spoke 'against the motion'. Anushka Roy secured the first position after debating 'for the motion' and Disha Lal debated 'against the motion' and secured the first position. Team 2 comprising Arakshita Saha and Disha Lal emerged as the Best Team of the event. A vote of thanks was given by the convenors of the programme - Dr Rina Kar Dutta, Associate Professor in Philosophy and Dr Maniparna Syam Roy, Assistant Professor in Economics.
