
Webinar - 'Ethics and privacy in digital age'





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


Data leakage example (2022)

- Wrong recipient: It happened to the Dutch municipality Assen, when an employee had sent a file
 containing 530 persons' personal data to the wrong email address. Simple mistake like auto-fill led to
 major consequences.
- Unsafe Servers: As early as January 2022 has an unsecured server resulted in the exposure of 3 terabyte of data including airport employee records. Among the data were ID card photos, personally identifiable information and national ID numbers... That's exactly the information cyber criminals need for identify fraud.
- criminals need for identity fraud.
 Weak Password: Create strong passwords, so you make it more difficult for malicious parties to gain access to your information. But that's not all: changing that password regularly is even more effective.
- Lack of right encryption: According to an audit done in early 2022, NASA employees were sending unencrypted email containing SBU data, personally identifiable information, and international Traffic in Arms Regulations data, any of which could expose the Agency to a risk
