- **BRIEF REPORT ABOUT THE EVENT/ PROGRAMME:**

The Cyber Hygiene Cell, Asutosh College in collaboration with IQAC, Asutosh College organized a one-day webinar on 'Cyber Crime and Cyber Security'. The speaker for the day Dr. Reshmi Naskar addressed several themes about cybercrime, cyber legislation, hacking, spamming, android hacking, and social media's benefits and drawbacks. She also provided realistic real-life instances of how hacking and other cybercrimes have harmed individuals. Dr. Naskar warned the pupils and discussed the different precautions they can take to protect themselves from such cybercrimes.
