BRIEF REPORT ABOUT THE EVENT:

Every year, The Department of Economics of Asutosh College organizes a Student's Seminar on any relevant topic. This year it has been organized on 25th April at the BBA Seminar Hall in ACTC Building of the college to present four best term papers of semester VI students. The first presentation was done by <u>Arkaprabha Das</u> who reviewed "**AI and Service led Growth Evidence from Indian Job Adverts**", where he talked about topics like surge in AI skill demand in recent years, displacement of high- skilled jobs due to it, its implications and contributions etc. The second presentation was by <u>Aushmita Adhya</u> on the topic "**Higher Education in India- Challenges and Opportunities**", written by Younis Ahmad Shiekh in 2017 and was published in *Journal of Education and Practice, Vol. 8, No. 1*. She discussed about the growth and recent development of Higher Education in India and also about the challenges faced and provided recommendations for solving them. The third presenter was Sampad Banerjee who reviewed "A Study of Gender Equality in India" written jointly by Priti Jha and Niti Nagar which was published in *The International Journal of Indian Psychology, Vol. 2, Issue 3.* He delved into the historical and socio-cultural dimensions of gender inequality, the social and cultural barriers and compared health statistics, sex ratio, infant mortality ratio, education, participation in the economy etc., of the two sexes. The last presentation was by <u>Krishnendu Das</u> on "Demographic Transition in India- An inter-state Analysis", where he discussed topics like the expanding stage of demographic transition, implications of the demographic transition model, challenges of the demographic transition theory and other related topics. The presenters were awarded certificates and souvenir by the professors of the department.
