Brief Report.

A one-day workshop titled "The Changing Face of Indian Media" was organized by the multilingual news agency Hindustan Samachar on Sunday, March 23. at the Kolkata Press Club. The workshop was attended by Arvind Bhalchandra Mardikar, Chairman of Hindustan Samachar, Arup Raha, former Justice Ranjit Kumar Bagh, senior journalists Rathindra Mohan Banerjee, Prosenjit Bakshi, Pulkesh Ghosh, Ashok Pandey, Jayaprakash Mishra, Devajyoti Chanda, Narayan Jain and other scholars.

After the opening ceremony of the program, Shri Arvind Bhalchandra Mardikar, Chairman of Hindustan Samachar, addressed the students. He, along with presenting news, highlighted the social responsibility of journalists to the students. The main objective of this workshop was to provide the students with a proper knowledge about the goals, limitations, importance, etc. of journalism. Donate and solve their questions about journalism. After this, Shri Prasenjit Bakshi highlighted the temptation of social media in the present world and various aspects of journalism in his speech. Shri Bakshi also laid special emphasis on mental preparation in the field of journalism in his speech. Along with this, he answered various questions of the students in the question-answer session. Journalist Pulkesh Ghosh's speech brought up the words of former eminent journalists who are pioneers for the new generation of journalists. On the other hand, Shri Jayaprakash Mishra, said "Journalism is a game of mind", and shed light on the main important issues in doing journalism. Along with this, Shri Ashok Pandey, Executive Editor of Bharatamitra Patrika, Former Justice Shri Ranjit Bagh, Professor Debajyoti Chanda and other eminent people gave important speeches on journalism.

The workshop has been organized for the last 15 years. The participating students and professors expressed hope that this one-day workshop was particularly useful for students and would be more fruitful for the future in terms of journalism.
