Topic : Effect of mobile addiction on mental health.

1. Excessive use of smartphones lead to attention deficit, sleeplessness, anxiety and tiredness

2. Teenagers tend to overuse their phones more than other age groups. Studies show the earlier a teen starts using a phone, the higher the risk of problematic use patterns.

3.During the last decade, there has been a widespread increase in the usage of mobile phones which resulted in an increase in electromagnetic radiations in the environment. These radiations have harmful effect on both plants and human being

4.Excessive smartphone use is associated with difficulties in cognitive-emotion regulation, impulsivity, impaired cognitive function, addiction to social networking, shyness and low self-esteem.

Feedback: Prof. Chatterjee spoke in detail regarding various negative outcomes of using phone. She mentioned some research data about how much time the young people are investing on cell phones. She also mentioned about the radiation and how that causing harm to the environment, some detrimental effects on mental health . 
Electronics: From Fabrication to Application The department of Electronics, in collaboration with the IQAC – Asutosh College, organized a two-day National level webinar named "Electronics: From Fabrication to Application" on 14th and 15th May 2022 and it was streamed live on the official channel of Asutosh College as well as through Google Meet platform. The resource persons of the said program are choosen from different locations of India namely Kolkata (University of Calcutta), Barasat – Kolkata (West Bengal State University), Hyderabad (BITS- Pilani Hyderabada Campus) and Warangal (SR University) with wide variety of technical expertise.

The program was announced all over the World through social media networks and personal contacts and as a result participants registered for the program not only from West Bengal but also from other states of India and from US and Japan as well. Total 178 number of registered participants attended the webinar very actively and interacted with the resource persons with several interesting doubts and questions.

On day-1, Dr. Arijit Roy of West Bengal State University gave his presentation on how basic semiconductor components can be utilized for several day to day activities of common people. Later on the same day, Prof. (Dr.) Sanatan Chattopadhyay presented another wonderful lecture on the process steps of semiconductor device fabrication which was not part of under-graduate course curriculum but an integral part of learning the semiconductor science and technology.

On day-2, Dr. Sandip Bhattacharya gave the 1st lecture on basic sensor technique in Humanoid Robots. Robotics is a new age application area of Electronics and Dr. Bhattacharya gave a wonderful presentation for the participants, specifically for the UG students and the participants enjoyed his lecture thoroughly. After that, Dr. Sayan Kanungo delivered his talk on Emerging Electronic Devices for Bio-sensing Application. Biosensors are modern day applications of Electronics that are widely used in various medical testing kits. Both the lectures motivated the participants to think out of the box and they asked several questions to the resource persons and they answered the questions with their expert knowledge.

The webinar was extremely successful in terms of active participation of the register participants from all over India and abroad. 
Paper Presenters: 10 students of the Department of Botany of Semesters 2, 4 and 6

The students and their mentors are now working towards achieving this landmark.


REPORT ON EXTENSION LECTURE




