#### 15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

College took initiative to conduct multidisciplinary/ interdisciplinary lectures/ seminars/ webinars/workshops etc. throughout the year. During 2021-2022, an interactive learning session was organized by IQAC on stock book entry and accounts maintenance, from which both teaching staff of defferent departments and non-teaching staff members benefitted. The Boost Laboratory committee conducted a webinar on "A green urge from grey earth" and the Environmental Science department conducted a seminar on "Only one Earth" which are most relevant today. Some awareness Programs were also initiated by Department of Biochemistry and Women Empowerment Cell in collaboration with IQAC on 'Thalassemia' and 'Dengue'. The Women Empowerment Cell in collaboration with the NSS unit and the IQAC unit also organised a one day workshop on 'Martial Arts and Self-Defense Skills' by which many students benefited. Karate and Yoga Therapy unit conducted an orientation program and Yoga competition among students of this college. The Cell for "Person with Disability, elderly person", organised a Sensitization and Awareness generation program on hearing impairment. Eco Club organised two very interesting webinars on 'Wetland and Carbon Sequestration' and 'Conservation breeding of rare and endangered animal'. Besides these, Birthday of Swami Vivekananda, Sir Asutosh Mookherjee, Rabindranath Tagore were celebrated by all students and teachers of the college. Van Mahotsav, Vasa Diwas, Republic Day and Independence Day were celebrated with great enthusiasm also. There were two interesting lectures on 'Raja Ram Mohan Roy on women empowerment' and on the life and work of 'Madam Curie'. Placement cell has arranged different webinar for student's awareness so that they can get help for shaping their future. Carrier counselling and training programme Unit has also organised 3 webinars for Carrier guidance and related issues by external experts from various fields

as well as internal faculties.

#### **16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):**

Asutosh College is prepared to register under the ABC to allow the students to avail the benefit of multiple entries and exit during the chosen programme, and to enable credit transfer. We believe that it would be highly beneficial for slow learners and also provide flexibility to students to learn as per their ability and convenience. Asutosh College is affiliated to the University of Calcutta and completely follows the curriculum framework and syllabi approved by and modified/changed from time to time by the University. The College will implement Academic Bank of Credits framework as per directives of the Higher Education Department, Government of West Bengal and the University of Calcutta. As and when the University adopts the ABC, the college will be prepared to implement it. In keeping with the curriculum of the affiliating University, the college has adopted the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) which allows students to choose their preferred Elective courses. The college will be able to adapt to the multiple entry and exit system and enter into collaborations with other colleges, University and international institutions with regard to the same. At present, students can earn extra credits through the online Certificate Courses conducted by the college and also through activities such as NSS, NCC, etc. Faculty members of the college have also adapted to the blended mode of teaching-learning pedagogy and implemented the learner-centric approach to academics. Teachers facilitate access to relevant online and offline resources to the students in addition to regular classroom teaching. They are constantly engaged in creating online content for the benefit of the students.

#### 17.Skill development:

The institution has made efforts to successfully run both B.Voc. and BBA (Affiliated to the University of Calcutta) along with some Soft Skill Programs for students in alignment with the National Skills Qualifications Framework. The institution has developed two categories of courses designed for both odd and even semesters respectively, with the aim of inculcating positivity in accordance with humanistic, ethical, constitutional and universal values of truth, righteous conduct, peace, love, non-violence, scientific temper, citizenship values along with life- and career skill developments. Adequate and multiple efforts have been taken by the institution to design a credit structure which includes MCQ pattern

of questions based on portions taught. The college also ensures that at least one such course is successfully completed by each student before graduating. The courses are designed to include Industry experts to train the students towards perfection in particular areas of interest. These courses are kept in Offline/ Online / Blended-mode depending on the convenience of the students and the course requirements. NSDC facilities have been associated to this in order to provide an efficient platform to manage activities like student enrolment, skill mapping and certification. Needless to say, those particular courses which cost a fortune elsewhere are taught effectively against nominal fees in Asutosh College engaging equivalent or even better training equipment.

## 18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

"Knowledge of India" will include knowledge of ancient India and modern India, and a clear sense of India's future aspirations with regard to education, health, environment, etc. (NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY, PARA 4.27)

Asutosh College realises the necessity of integrating the Indian Knowledge system into the curriculum for development of a 'society' deeply rooted in our civilization and culture and to inculcate in its students the importance of the nation's rich cultural and linguistic/literary heritage.

The college ensures that all the courses are taught bilingually, that is, in English as well as in Bengali (barring the courses in English Language and Literature and Bengali Language and Literature) although the primary medium of instruction is English. Teachers make special efforts to explain concepts in Hindi as well whenever required. They also provide reading materials in Bangla/ Hindi along with those in English for reference. The college has a number of language departments namely Sanskrit, Bengali, Hindi and English that offer programs that emphasize on language, culture, and traditions of our country. In addition to the regular courses, the college runs a number of certificate courses to empower students with the knowledge of India. Students of any discipline are eligible to enrol for these courses which cover domains like 'Herbal plant benefits and scope', 'Wildlife conservation', 'Apiculture and sericulture', 'Fundamentals of Mathematics' amongst many others. Besides, the college strongly believes a healthy mind in a healthy body would subsequently build a 'value-adding' citizen and with this in mind encourages sports and holds 'yoga' and karate classes for its students.

Additionally, the college plans to hold workshops/seminars in traditional Indian languages, use of Ayurveda in everyday life, different dance forms, traditional Indian cooking and such like, shortly. The college has an extensive medicinal plants' garden at the Bhasa campus with plans to use it for knowledge transfer of Ayurveda to students as well as for the benefit and use of the local people.

As a good practice college consciously ensures use of Indian language in dissemination of lectures every day in the class. Additional open-source resources too are provided so that the students can understand the subject in Indian language.

#### **20.Distance education/online education:**

The Asutosh College Post Graduate Study Centre offers various courses across humanities, science and management through distance mode. The courses offered here allow the candidate to advance their skill and knowledge in their existing discipline or explores options in other fields. These courses also enable the candidate to build on his/her undergraduate knowledge, and gain the expertise needed to drive his/her career forward. The Study Centre was established in 2012 under Vidyasagar University. It offers M.A. courses in English, Political Science, Sanskrit and History; M.Sc. courses in Environmental Science, Chemistry and M.Com Courses in Financial Accounting and Management, Cost Accounting. Theses course are offered in distance mode/learning.

- ? To improve specialization in candidates in order to empower them for research.
- ? To improve the overall knowledge and experience, and thereby to improve the potentiality of the candidate in the competitive work atmosphere.
- ? To develop a question-seeking and problem-solving mind to lead and serve the society.

#### Infrastructure

PG Study center has two lecture halls and two modern laboratories of both Environmental Sciences (ENVS) and Chemistry keeping all the statutory norms and safety standards in mind. They are equipped with some of the most accurate digital measuring instruments required for measuring chemicals. A scientific temperament is developed in the students along with the ability to analyze, collate, compute, integrate and deduce. In the laboratories, the students learn to handle apparatus and chemicals. They improve their understanding of various chemical reactions and chemical processes. The ENVS laboratory maintains field equipment for environmental studies in terrestrial, fresh water, and marine environments, including research boats, soil and sediment coring devices, soil sampling devices, an electronic sub-bottom profiler and many other equipment and materials.

#### Online Education

During the pandemic the classes were shifted to the online mode. Classes were conducted through online platforms like Google meet, Zoom, etc. Class notes and study materials were shared via Google classrooms. Different assignments and it's submission was done smoothly through the Google classrooms. The College maintains a customized Learning Management System (LMS) that stores lecture

materials for courses in different programs. The students can easily access these notes and use them for their benefit. The institute promotes the usage of ICT enabled classrooms. Classrooms are equipped with projectors which are used to deliver PowerPoint presentations. Departments are equipped with computer laboratories and a good student-computer ratio is maintained. All computers have the latest LAN connectivity so that data can be shared from one machine to the other very easily. Library has an adequate number of LAN connected computers, where students can access various digital materials under NLIST, Sage, Jstor, Oup, Mcgrawhill, etc. The institute maintains a high speed central WIFI connection which can be used by all the stakeholders for their various educational needs. There are twenty certificate courses which are offered by the institute related to various disciplines which help in the skill development of the students. The Institute is planning to maintain a digital repository of course material for all the courses of UG and PG programs. Various Webinars/workshops/web lectures are organized by different departments in collaboration with the IQAC from time to time for the benefit of the students and the faculties. Online platforms like Google Meet, Zoom, Webex, etc. are used for these purposes. These lectures are broadcasted online in the dedicated YouTube channel of the institute.

#### 1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

- 1.1.1 The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process
  - For effective implementation of the curriculum, the College organizes orientation programmes. The Academic sub-committee is responsible for

The college rigorously follows University of Calcutta's evaluation guidelines. All official notices about such examinations are posted on the college's official website. The college authority has formed a committee to be in charge of creating a subject-wise exam timetable for the departments. The examination method involvesthe setting and compiling of question papers, the assessment of answer scripts within a given time frame, and the submission of results. The grades for attendance and tutorials are also updated by the professors. In case of any error in this process, the college authority and all the departments also ensure immediate action. The correct information is forwarded to the University.

Due to the pandemic in 2020-21, the full internal assessment evaluation was done online. Teachers used email or Google Classrooms to complete assessments. Apart from a ten-mark internal test administered by University of Calcutta rules, students are regularly assessed through online projects, quizzes, and presentations. Solid waste is collected daily from various points and separated

into dry and wet. Colour-coded dustbins are used, as green for wet and blue for solid. The housekeeping personnel are responsible for daily removal and disposal of garbage to the KMC authorized personnel. All wastewater lines from toilets are connected with municipal drainage mains. Waste materials like plastic, papers are collected and disposed to scrap vendors.

Initiatives have been taken to produce compost manure from the canteen solid waste and the entire process is efficiently run by the students. Manure is used for the purpose of herbal gardening. Wastes from life science departments of our college are autoclaved and discarded. The chemical -contaminated water from Chemistry and Biochemistry laboratories passes through concealed pipelines into soak pits and recycled water is used for the watering of trees or non-potable purpose. E-wastes such as empty toners, cartridges, outdated computers and electronic items are sold as scrap to ensure their safe recycling. Old monitors and CPUs are repaired and reused.

With financial support of SERB Scientific Social Responsibility Policy and Asutosh College research Centre, 25 college and school students were selected for a day long training on solid waste management and recycling.

Sparsha(Touch), the Asutosh College Retired Teachers' Wellness and Well-being Committee is a unit that began functioning under the aegis of the Tea Club in 2017. The Tea Club itself is a unique feature of our college, established in the late 1980s to facilitate informal interaction among teachers over a cuppa. Retired teachers are like metaphorical bridges between the past and the present, inspiring the current crop to follow in their footsteps so that they in turn may pass on the legacy to future generations of teachers. With the aim of reaching out to them and providing that caring touch, the Tea Club constituted a unit - Asutosh College Retired Teachers' Wellness and Well-being Committee - in 2017. ### 2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

The college rigorously follows University of Calcutta's evaluation guidelines. All official notices about such examinations are posted on the college's official website. The college authority has formed a committee to be in charge of creating a subject-wise exam timetable for the departments. The examination method involvesthe setting and compiling of question papers, the assessment of answer scripts within a given time frame, and the submission of results. The grades for attendance and tutorials are also updated by the professors. In case of any error in this process, the college authority and all the departments also ensure immediate action. The correct information is forwarded to the University.

Due to the pandemic in 2020-21, the full internal assessment evaluation was done online. Teachers used email or Google Classrooms to complete assessments. Apart from a ten-mark internal test administered by University of Calcutta rules, students are regularly assessed through online projects, quizzes, and presentations. Remedial steps are also taken by the teachers for the weaker students.

The college ensures successful evaluation of students' performance through various methods for measuring the attainment of each program outcome and course outcome.

Each department designs its academic curriculum in accordance with the program/course outcome. Interactive-participative learning and extra classes for slow learners are regularly organized by the departments. The class encourages the development of analytical thinking, writing, and oratory skills. Experts do an evaluation of these skills through appropriate tools like Group discussions, Laboratory Experiments, Viva voce, Objective tests, Home assignments, etc.

Complementary learning plans are also executed through special seminars/webinars, student paper/PowerPoint presentations, debates, quiz competitions, fieldwork, poster designing, documentary/film show, etc.

Asutosh College acquired an adjacent property in 2020 for establishing a dedicated research centre for both science and humanities. Solid waste is collected daily from various points and separated into dry and wet. Colour-coded dustbins are used, as green for wet and blue for solid. The housekeeping personnel are responsible for daily removal and disposal of garbage to the KMC authorized personnel. All wastewater lines from toilets are connected with municipal drainage mains. Waste materials like plastic, papers are collected and disposed to scrap vendors.

Initiatives have been taken to produce compost manure from the canteen solid waste and the entire process is efficiently run by the students. Manure is used for the purpose of herbal gardening. Wastes from life science departments of our college are autoclaved and discarded. The chemical -contaminated water from Chemistry and Biochemistry laboratories passes through concealed pipelines into soak pits and recycled water is used for the watering of trees or non-potable purpose. E-wastes such as empty toners, cartridges, outdated computers and electronic items are sold as scrap to ensure their safe recycling. Old monitors and CPUs are repaired and reused.

With financial support of SERB Scientific Social Responsibility Policy and Asutosh College research Centre, 25 college and school students were selected for a day long training on solid waste management and recycling.
