<p>College took initiative to conduct multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary lectures/seminars/workshops etc. throughout the year. Boost Laboratory committee conducted a webinar on "A green urge from grey earth" and Environmental Science conducted a seminar on "Only one Earth" which are most relevant today. Some awareness Programs are also been initiated by Department of Biochemistry and Women Empowerment Cell in collaboration with IQAC on 'Thalassemia' and 'Dengue'. They also organised one day workshop on 'Martial Art Skill' by which many students were benefitted. Karate and Yoga Therapy unit conducted an orientation program and Yoga competition among students of this college. Cells for Person with Disability, elderly person, organised a Sensitization and Awareness generation program on hearing impairment. Eco Club organised two very interesting webinars on 'Wetland and Carbon Sequestration' and 'Conservation breeding of rare and endangered animal'. Beside these, Birthday of Swami Vivekananda, Sir Asutosh Mokherjee, Rabindranath Tagore was celebrated by all students and teachers of the college. Van Mahotsav, Vasa Diwas, Republic day and Independence day were celebrated with great enthusiasm also. There was two interesting lectures on 'Raja Ram Mohan Roy on women empowerment' and on the life and work of 'Madam Curie'. Placement cell has arranged different webinar for student's awareness so that they can get help for shaping their future.</p>

Asutosh College is enthusiastic to register under the ABC to allow the students to avail the benefit of multiple entries and exit	

during the chosen programme, and to enable credit transfer. We believe that it would be highly beneficial to slow learners and also provide flexibility to students to learn as per their ability and convenience.

Asutosh College, affiliated to the University of Calcutta, completely adheres to the curriculum framework and syllabi as approved by the University. The College will follow the directives of the Higher Education Department, Government of West Bengal and the affiliating University as regards registering on the ABC platform. The College, however, is trying to make every effort to ensure that as and when the affiliating University adopts the ABC, we will be prepared to implement it.

The faculty members of the college have adapted to the blended mode of teaching-learning pedagogy and have completely implemented the learner-centric approach. The existing choice based credit system offers elective courses where students can choose which courses they want to opt.

17.Skill development:

The National Education Policy underscores the pivotal role of skill development, and Asutosh College has proactively responded to this imperative by introducing skill oriented certificate courses for all its students. Among these courses, a dedicated program focused on communication and soft skill development has been implemented to enhance students' proficiency and prepare them for the demands of the professional world.

Furthermore, the college recognizes the importance of technical competence in the modern age and addresses this by offering a fundamental computer course during the first year of undergraduate studies. This early exposure equips students with the technical knowledge required to keep pace with the rapidly evolving technological landscape.

In addition to these core courses, Asutosh College provides a specialized program in career counselling, which serves to nurture students' employability skills, ensuring they are well-prepared for the job market upon graduation.

Additionally, skill development is seamlessly integrated into the regular undergraduate and postgraduate curricula endorsed by the University of Calcutta. Thus, the college not only ensures that students receive a well-rounded education but also promotes and

encourages their pursuit of additional skills through its certificate courses.

18. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

"Knowledge of India" will include knowledge from ancient India and modern India, and a clear sense of India's future aspirations with regard to education, health, environment, etc." (NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY, PARA 4.27)

Asutosh College realizes the necessity of integrating the Indian Knowledge system into the curriculum to ensure that students gain acquaintance with the rich cultural and linguistic heritage of the country and learn the value and importance of the treasure of traditional Indian knowledge systems, its diversity and extent.

- In keeping with the institutional mission of imparting education with an inclusive approach, all courses except those that are language-specific like Bengali and English (teaching media Bengali and English respectively) are taught bilingually (English as well as Bengali) although the medium of instruction is English. Teachers make special efforts to explain in Hindi as well wherever feasible. Teachers also provide reference and reading material in the vernacular to cater to students who opt to write their examinations in Bengali.
- The college has a number of language-literature departments namely Sanskrit, Bengali, and English offering full programmes with components that highlight the language, literary culture, and traditions of our country.
- The college also runs a number of certificate courses covering domains like 'Herbal Plants: Benefits and Scope', 'Wildlife Conservation in India', 'Apiculture and Sericulture', 'Travel and Tourism', in which students from any discipline are eligible to enrol.
- Yoga classes/sessions are held for students and staffs, since a healthy mind in a healthy body would subsequently build a 'value-adding' citizen.

Additionally, the college plans to hold workshops/seminars on the use of Ayurveda in everyday life, different dance forms, traditional Indian cooking shortly. The college has an extensive medicinal plants garden in the Bhasa campus which suffered significantly during the cyclonic storms of Amphan and Yash in Bengal, but is now being revived in full swing, for knowledge transfer of Ayurveda to

students.

Different departments of Asutosh College, besides conducting regular academic programmes, offer students opportunities for training in academics including Teaching and Research (NET/ SET/ GATE/ SSC/CSC), Civil Services examinations, Professional Writing, Creative/Content Writing/Blogging, Publishing, Journalism (Print/Electronic Media), Advertising, Filmmaking, IT Industry, collaborative project work, internship.

M.A. programmes in English, Political Science, Sanskrit, and History, M.Sc. programmes in Environmental Science and Chemistry, and M.Com. programmes in Financial Accounting and Management and Cost Accounting courses are available through distance learning under Vidyasagar University and Indira Gandhi National Open University.

1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation	
1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process	
To deliver the course curriculum effectively, the College monitors	

teaching - learning process throughout the year. The Academic Subcommittee has taken the following steps:

- An orientation programme is organized to inform new students about infrastructure of the college.
- The routines are distributed to the students before the commencement of classes.
- The classes are held regularly by strictly following a master routine.
- Syllabus is distributed among the departmental staff in a documented manner.
- Faculty submit their teaching plan to the Academic Subcommittee and Head of the Departments ensure that the syllabus is completed within the stipulated time.
- Each department conducts regular internal class tests to monitor the progress of students.
- Remedial classes included in the routine are taken for weak students to improve their results.
- LCD projectors, laptops and internet connections are used to deliver lectures beyond conventional chalk-and-talk method.
- Analysis of results post-publication is done and discussed among the administration and the Departments for further improvement. Books from the central and departmental seminar libraries are lent to the students and the records are documented.
- There are 20 certificate courses to groom students for future jobs.

- The institution regularly conducts seminar lectures where students of different disciplines participate and topics related to Gender sensitization, Human values, and Environmental sustainability are discussed by relevant field experts.
- The seminars are documented and relevant notices for all students and faculty members are uploaded on the college website.
- In the year 2022-2023, there were total 40 lectures arranged on these subjects, where topics as varied as Religion and Politics in the Vedic Era, Invisibility of Women at work, Feminism and Postmodernism, Harappan civilization, Geography of the Gangetic valley and plains, Media literacy, Community Radio, Essentials of Personal Branding were presented by the subject experts.
- The importance and value of professional ethics, environment and its sustainability, gender and human values are inculcated into the students not only through seminar lectures, but also through various activities like tree planting, industrial visits, counselling sessions arranged by the college authority throughout the year.
- In the present era, these hands-on experiences help students to understand society and their social responsibilities.

The college makes sustained efforts to enrich students so that they realize their academic potential and evolve into future scholars,professionals, or entrepreneurs. Some very effective methods adopted are:

- Students are given enough opportunity to discuss their doubts with faculty members during and after classes to hone their intellectual abilities.

- Remedial, tutorial classes are held quite frequently.
- Class tests are conducted after completion of teaching assignments to assess understanding and assimilation levels of students and observe their progress.
- Students' seminar, poster presentations, extempore competition, flipped classroom teaching, Science/ Earth/ Poetry/ Environment Day presentations are organized for increasing levels of confidence, improving communication skills and instilling interest in diverse areas of knowledge.
- Teaching scientific concepts through a combined theoretical-experimental approach for better assimilation.
- Student internships are arranged for by some departments as also educational tours and field visits by others.
- Industrial visits are arranged by departments which are directly linked to or dependent on industry.
- Alumni talks are conducted to encourage current students and give them necessary information regarding career options in their respective subjects.

- College follows the evaluation guidelines of the Boards of Studies of the University of Calcutta.
- All official notices about University Examinations are provided in the official website of the College. Departmental heads also communicate the information to students in Whatsapp groups, Google Classroom.
- A designated Committee (Examination Committee) in the college arranges subject-wise examination schedule for all departments.
- Examination process involves setting question papers, assessment of answer scripts within a given time frame, submission of marks and generating award lists.
- Apart from an internal test of 10 marks as per University of Calcutta rules, students are regularly assessed through class tests, tutorials, project preparation. Remedial steps are also taken by the teachers for weaker students.
- Attendance records and tutorial marks are uploaded in the University portal.
- Students can report their exam-related grievances through letters in a dropbox or through the heads of the departments.
